VA Verification eligibility extended to three years

All PTAC counselors should be alert to this important change in the VA's Veterans-First Contracting program: beginning March 21, 2017, verification eligibility for the program will change from a 24 month period to a 36 month period. Participants must now submit a reverification application only every three (3) years to continue eligibility.

As a result of this change, effective March 21 all currently verified participants will receive an automatic one (1) year extension on their current eligibility period, beginning on the date of expiration. This change will be reflected in the firm's VIP profile, but updated approval letters will not be sent.

Companies currently in the re-verification process that have already been assigned a Case Analyst may either: 1) continue with the re-verification process and (if approved) receive a new verification term of three years, or 2) withdraw the application and receive an automatic one year extension of their current verification period, beginning on the date of expiration.

For anyone who has submitted an application for re-verification but has not yet been assigned a Case Analyst, the CVE will administratively remove the application and issue an automatic one year extension of the current verification period, beginning on the date of expiration.
